


A JOURNEY OF FAITH: MOVING MOUNTAINS - MANIFESTING MIRACLES



# Guest Speaker Reverend Dr. Walter Malone, Jr.



hen the young man stepped through the doors of Fisk University, he didn't dream of the influence he would have over the lives of so many people. But years later, Dr. Walter Malone, Jr. is still empowering people to not settle for "good" but rather strive to become great men and women of God.

A native of Tennessee, Dr. Malone attended Fisk University and later Nashville's American Baptist College where he earned his B.A. in Theology. He received his Masters Degree and 28 hours above his Masters in Religious studies at Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky and received his Doctorate of Ministry from the United Theological Seminary. During his studies, Dr. Malone also became a Samuel D. Proctor-Otis Moss, Jr. Fellow.

Although Dr. Malone became one of the areas leading pastoral theologians, he learned to bring the words of the Bible to everyone, giving humanitarian service and contributing tremendously to the lives of the community at large. As an ardent fiduciary, he still oversees the development of several ministries that are strengthening the lives of people and making a substantial difference in the Louisville community. However, a work very close to Dr. Malone's heart began during his doctoral work, later giving birth to the nonprofit Canaan Community Development Corporation (CCDC). After more than twelve years, CCDC continues to foster social and economic empowerment in distressed communities to help families rebuild their neighborhoods and create vibrant communities. CCDC is involved in housing development, job training, computer literacy, GED literacy and various educational programs.

Throughout the years, the winning over of souls has been the greatest reward Dr. Malone could ask for. But during his studies and mission work he has received several honors and recognitions to include: Who's Who Among Students in American Colleges and Universities; Outstanding Young Man of America, 1982 and 1989; Mayor's Citation and Distinguished Citizen Award—1991 from Mayor Jerry E. Abramson; 1995 Black Achievers Award and continues to serve in many local and national Christian service and philanthropic organizations. Memberships include: Delta Epsilon Society and Theta Epsilon Society, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. He is affiliated with the NAACP, the National Baptist Convention, USA, Inc., and the American Baptist Churches of the South. Dr. Malone is former president of the Interdenominational Ministerial Coalition in Louisville.

All the while working as an ambassador for God, Dr. Malone has traveled extensively throughout the nation. His profound gift of homiletic and exegesis delivery of preaching, teaching and casting visions to the 21 st century church stirs, rekindles and sets afire the hearts of people. Whenever and wherever Dr. Malone preaches, he challenges listeners through theological, spiritual and pastoral insight to work their vision and walk in their purpose. The anointing on his life permeates the message as he invites the listeners to invoke God for themselves.

Dr. Malone had truly accomplished great things for the Lord. Today one of the accomplishments he is most proud of started over two decades ago, when he stepped out by Divine inspiration with 97 people and

became the founder and Pastor of one of the fastest growing churches in Kentucky—Canaan Missionary Baptist Church—now Canaan Christian Church. A prominent leader and prolific visionary, Dr. Malone boldly continues to move his congregation of over 4,000 to higher heights of Kingdom building. His mission for the congregation is clear and precise: they are dedicated to promoting the Gospel of Jesus Christ to every individual through: evangelistic outreach, family enrichment, economic empowerment, educational excellence, and community involvement.

Currently Dr. Malone serves on the Board of Trustees for Spalding University and the Board of Directors for the Louisville Community Development Bank. Several times a week, Dr. Malone can be heard preaching the gospel via television broadcast and radio. He is also the author of two books. The first, entitled "An Operative Faith for an Oppressed People," is a collection of sermons about how Christian faith is nurtured in the lives of people who are oppressed by sin. His second book, From Holy Power to Holy Profits, deals with the responsibility of the church to engage in community development. More books are forthcoming.

Dr. Malone, a devoted husband and loving father, lives in Louisville, Kentucky, with his wife Sandra, Minister of Counseling at Canaan, and his son, Walter III, a college sophomore.
